



Fremont County Weed Management DO NOT SPRAY REQUEST INFORMATION

Fremont County Weed Management is responsible for managing noxious weeds along county rights-of-way throughout Fremont County.

The Do Not Spray Request program allows property landowners to voluntarily manage noxious weeds along the county right-of-way adjacent to their property instead of county herbicide treatment.

By submitting a Do Not Spray Request, the landowner agrees to assume responsibility for managing noxious weeds within the requested area.

Failure to properly manage noxious weeds in the designated area may result in Fremont County Weed Management resuming treatment operations without further notice.

This request applies only to county rights-of-way and does not affect treatment on private property.

Request Duration

Approved requests are valid for one calendar year, beginning January 1 and expiring December 31 of the same year.

It is the sole responsibility of the landowner to reapply annually if they wish to remain on the Do Not Spray list.

Signage Requirements

Approved properties must post DO NOT SPRAY signs that meet the following requirements:

- Signs shall be posted near the right-of-way without encroaching into the road right-of-way, allowing road maintenance and traffic to continue normally.
- Signs must be posted at each end of the landowner's property along the roadway.

County weed treatment will stop at the first sign and resume after the last sign.

- Signs must be clearly visible to approaching traffic.
- Signs must be mounted at least 36 inches above the ground and free of visual obstructions.
- Lettering must be large enough to be visible from at least 20 yards away.
- Signs must be maintained to ensure continued visibility throughout the season. Signs should not be attached to utility poles, traffic control signs, or county infrastructure.

Please complete the Do Not Spray Request Form for the current year.

If more than one parcel is being submitted, a separate request form must be completed for each parcel.
