Applicants may draw a simple diagram showing their property, the adjacent county road, and the locations where “Do Not Spray” signs will be posted.

Step 4 — Landowner Responsibilities

By submitting this request, I understand and agree to:

- ✓ Manage noxious weeds along the county right-of-way adjoining my property
- ✓ Follow the Fremont County Noxious Weed Management Plan
- ✓ Post visible “DO NOT SPRAY” signs at each end of the designated area
- ✓ Maintain signs so they remain visible
- ✓ Reapply for this request every year

Failure to meet these requirements may result in termination of this agreement and Fremont County may resume weed treatment.

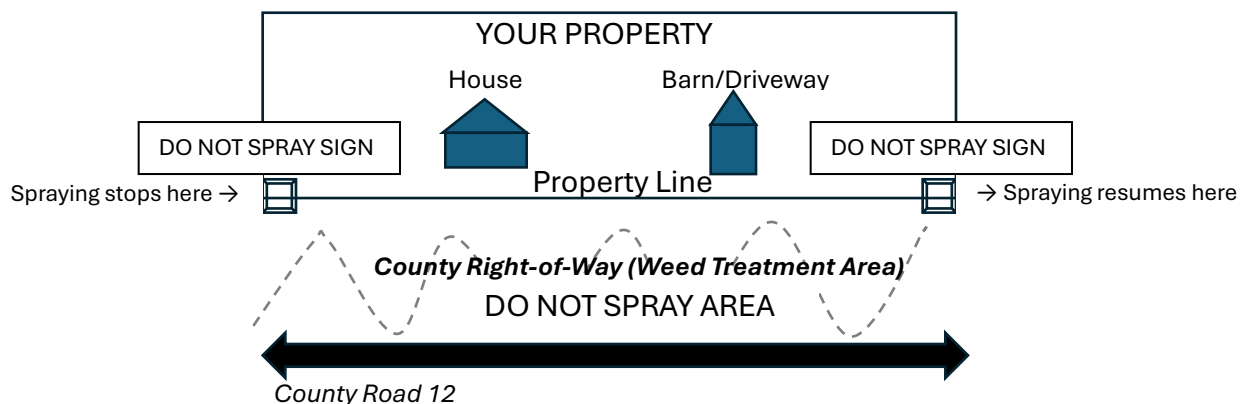

Example 1 — Example Diagram of Do Not Spray Area

Example:



Example showing a property adjacent to County Road 12.

The landowner places a "Do Not Spray" sign at each end of their property along the county right-of-way.

County weed treatment operations stop at the first sign and resume after the last sign.

The area between the two signs is the designated "Do Not Spray Area."

County Road Name: County Road 12

Property Orientation: South side of road

Beginning: Mile Marker 10

End: Fenceline near red barn

Spraying will stop at the first sign and resume after the last sign.

Signs must:

- Be at least 36 inches above ground
- Be visible from 20 yards away
- Posted at both ends of the property
- Outside the travel lane and shoulder
- Not obstructing traffic or road maintenance

Example 2 — Example Sign Placement Guide for Do Not Spray Area

“DO NOT SPRAY” Sign Placement Guide

- ✓ Signs must be clearly visible from the road.
- ✓ Post at both ends of the property.
- ✓ Do not attach to utility poles, traffic signs or county property.

Mount sign to
a sturdy T-post



Use a separate
wooden stake
