Around the month of April, you may see pinwheels planted in the community and wonder, why? It's because planting pinwheels represents the bright childhoods we all want for children.

In 2008, Prevent Child Abuse America introduced the pinwheel as the new national symbol for child abuse prevention through Pinwheels for Prevention. Pinwheels symbolize the notions of playfulness, joy, and childhood. It serves as a reminder of the great childhoods we want for all children. The cyclical nature of the pinwheel depicts positive cycles of the love and support we want to help families create.

You may also notice that we are wearing Blue Ribbons. In 1989, the Blue Ribbon Campaign to Prevent Child Abuse had its early beginnings as a Virginia grandmother's tribute to her grandson who died as a result of abuse. She tied a blue ribbon to the antenna of her car as a way to remember him and to alert her community to the tragedy of child abuse. The Blue Ribbon Campaign has since expanded across the country, and many wear blue ribbons each April in memory of those who have died as a result of child abuse and to bring awareness to this important cause.

While the proclamation today focuses on April being Child abuse prevention month, as a Department, we see on a day to day basis how prevention is truly year-round and not just for one month out of the year...with that here is the proclamation for April 2025...
