

RESOLUTION NO. _____, SERIES OF 2026

**EXTENDING THE DISASTER DECLARATION REGARDING “24 FIRE” WILDLAND
FIRE TO MIDNIGHT ON APRIL 15, 2026**

WHEREAS, on March 20, 2026, the Chair of the Board of County Commissioners declared a Local Disaster emergency retroactive to March 17, 2026 due to the 24 Fire Wildland Fire located in unincorporated northeastern Fremont County, Colorado near the Penrose Community; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to C.R.S. § 24-33.5-709, the Declaration of the Local Disaster Emergency, is due to expire on March 24, 2026, seven days following the initiation of the Local Disaster Emergency Declaration; and

WHEREAS, the Fremont County Emergency Manager has advised the Board of County Commissioners of Fremont County (“the Board”) that emergency management response, recovery and mitigation efforts are continuing, but have not been completed; and

WHEREAS, the Fremont County Emergency Manager and Fremont County Sheriff have informed the Board of County Commissioners that an extension and continuation of the Declaration of a Local Disaster Emergency, is necessary to continue the County’s access to state and federal resources for response, recovery and mitigation efforts; and

WHEREAS, C.R.S. § 24-33.5-709 permits the Board of County Commissioners to continue or renew the local disaster emergency declaration for a period in excess of seven days, if necessary to continue the response and recovery aspects of the local disaster emergency.

**NOW THEREFORE, THE FREMONT COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY
COMMISSIONERS HEREBY MAKES THE FOLLOWING DECLARATIONS:**

1. **Extension of Declaration.** The Declaration of Local Disaster Emergency dated March 20, 2026, is hereby approved and extended to April 15, 2026, due to the continuation of the response, recovery and mitigation of the 24 Fire Wildland Fire in unincorporated northeastern Fremont County, Colorado near the Penrose community.
2. **Emergency Plans.** Execution of all applicable local disaster emergency plans, interjurisdictional disaster emergency plans, and mutual aid agreements shall continue.
3. **Authorization.** The Director of the Office of Emergency Management, the Board of County Commissioners, the Fremont County Sheriff, and the County Administrator have full authority to assign county personnel, expend financial resources (in consultation with the Board of County Commissioners), use emergency procurement procedures, suspend and re-assign any county operations or policy to provide full support to the emergency response.

4. Ratification. The Board hereby ratifies all other actions reasonably necessary to cope with the emergency taken by individual commissioners, elected officials, department heads, and emergency management personnel since the initial declaration of local disaster emergency.

5. Distribution. Copies of this declaration shall be given prompt and general publicity through all local media sources, on the County website and Facebook page, and also shall be filed promptly with the County Clerk and Recorder, the Office of Emergency Management, and the Colorado Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management, and other such agencies and entities as designated by the Board of Commissioners or as deemed necessary for the health, safety and welfare of the community.

6. Safety. The adoption of this Resolution is necessary for the immediate preservation of public health, safety and welfare.

7. Severability. All provisions of this Resolution are intended to be severable. If a court or administrative body declares any provision or its application to be invalid or unenforceable, in whole or in part, such determination shall not affect, impair or invalidate any other provision of this Resolution. If a court or administrative body determines a provision or its application to be valid or enforceable only if its application is limited, its application shall be limited as required to most fully implement its purpose.

8. Amendment/Extension. The BOCC reserves the right to further amend, extend or terminate this declaration at any time prior to its termination date.

9. Effective Date. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon adoption by the Board of County Commissioners.
