

## Fremont County Weed Management DO NOT SPRAY REQUEST

It is the responsibility of Fremont County Weed Management to manage the county rights-of-way for noxious weeds within its jurisdiction. Do Not Spray Request applications are a voluntary alternate management practice for treating noxious weed species along adjacent property rights-of-way. Landowners who apply for the request assume the responsibility to manage noxious weeds within their requested zone. Failure to manage noxious weeds as required will result in Fremont County Weed Management resume spraying operations immediately. Applications are valid for one calendar year, starting January 1<sup>st</sup> and expiring December 31<sup>st</sup> of the same year. It is the sole responsibility of the landowner to re-apply once the request application has expired. Proper signage must be visibly posted with the following requirements:

- Signs shall be posted in the vicinity of the right-of-way(s) without encroaching in the right-of-way to allow for road maintenance operations and traffic flow to continue normally.
- Signs must be posted on each end of the Property Landowner's property. Fremont County weed treatment operations will cease at the first sign and continue immediately after the last sign is posted.
- Signage must be clearly visible by approaching traffic, be at least 36 inches off the ground and free of obstruction(s) of the view.
- Signs and lettering must be large enough to view with the naked eye from at least 20 yards away.
- Signs must be maintained to ensure continued visibility.
