Committee Reports

2026 County Fair – Will be at Pathfinder. All evacuated animals will be out and will be able to set up and paint panels with the help of the inmates. Outdoorsman cancelled their 2 day event so the tent will cost fairboard more. Amanda E. is waiting for a quote from Canon Rental for just the tent for the fair.

Advertising and marketing –

Will send in for the center of the Shopper.

- Kevin will run a insert with the flyer in the Florence Reporter. 500 inserts will be double sided the size of flyers.
- Flyers will be distributed now that a location is secured for the fair.

Building – Orientation is Thursday July 16th for Jr Superintendents and superintendents. 10 memorials for the memorial wall.

- Judges meals will be with concession or meal vouchers.

Vendors/Food Trucks – Tiffany – 9 food trucks signed up

Market Livestock Sale – Gina will confirm with alcohol vendor and auctioneer now that the location of the fair is secure. She will be working on having the buyer sign updated.

Rodeo – CPRA Secretary will be going in the horse shed. Mykel will bring down a power plant. Amanda E. will talk to Kelsey and D'wayne and make sure there is enough perimeter fence.

Shooting Sports – Shotgun and air rifle went well. Archery can use a shed and Julianne is going to get the room AC from the 4-H Building. Angie may have a portable starlink to use.

Sponsorships & Awards – Tami picked up plaques and horse trophies – new top gun plaque. Tami paid \$100 and has a bill for Moore's John moved to pay the trophy bills and Kevin seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Kevin reported that the City of Florence wanted to donate to cat show. He will work with them.

- FFA – Scavenger hunt – kids come turn in the stamped cards for a prize with a map to help send them around. Amanda E. will send a list of activities.

Silent Auction – None

Cornerstone- Deposit for the saddle club to come in September. Meeting is Monday.

Horse Project - All Buckles are sponsored. All member's passed their level 1 test (Safety Test)

Rodeo Queen contest – No applicants.

Pens of Progress – Paint is ready. New banner is ordered with the additional sponsors. Gina asked if they need to recognize the new sponsors/ sponsors before the sale. Brandon will get a list together.

Special Committee Reports -

Extension – Fire evacuations – As animals go home everything will be shifting back to fair prep.

Other Correspondences:

July 16 – Amanda E. emailed the new quote from Canon Rental for the tent. Delores moved to rent the tent for the cost of \$7,016. Tami seconded the motion. Motion carried,

July 21 – Amanda E. emailed that Kelsey Crowder requested a payment of \$600 to the rodeo photographer. This is something the rodeo committee usually approves within their budget but did not have an official meeting. Brandon moved to pay the photographer and Kristina seconded the motion. Tami and Chris opposed.

Fair morning meetings:

July 28th –

- Ace Talbot requests that the board considers letting utility goats sign up a back up goat in case they are unable to use one. Tami moved to allow Ace to bring a different utility goat and they are responsible for a vet check. Brandon seconded the motion. Motion carried.
- Dylan Hobby - Dylan is asking for a one time exemption for the weight of his steer. He was evacuated on June 29th. His steer was 985 at open weigh prior to evacuation and the steer weighed in at 860 lbs. Dylan is willing to keep him for a buyer for another 30 days to finish feeding him out. Delores moves to refer the decision to sale committee. Angie seconded the motion. Motion carried. Sale committee will meet and discuss.
 - Brandon suggested adding a clause for act of god in fairbook.
 - Drenching also needs updated in Fairbook for hydration purposes.
- Need to start interviews at 9 am again. Delores said if livestock members let them know they will arrange interviews as needed.
- Small animal check in – there were a lot of members early for check in. Kristina is missing a big black metal kennel. Market Chickens were getting too hot and 2 died. Casey Combie brought in another portable kennel and Canon rental donated a big fan to help cool the animals.
- During ultrasounds there was a verbal altercation between John Daniels and Cody Hall. Cody Hall accused John Daniels for putting hands on Anthony Hall. Information was passed along and a special meeting will be called if needed.

July 29th –

- Sale committee approved the exemption for Dylan Hobby's steer.
- The Power plant generator will need fuel to keep everything running. Also needed a swamp cooler pump. Tami moved to purchase a pump and fuel for the generator. Linda seconded the motion. Motion carried.
- Tyreal Lester – asking for an exemption for his underweight hog. His pig weighed in at 180 pounds and was outside of the evacuation zone. Referred to Sale Committee

- Cynthia wanted to address the breeding class for goats and look into changing the name to Breeding MEAT/MARKET Goat. Dairy goats are showing in Dairy and Breeding and have 2 opportunities to show in showmanship with the same animal. Dairy in itself is a breeding class.

July 30th –

- Pig Show pictures went smooth. There were 2 situations
 - Wrong 2nd place animal was brought in for division champion. The announcing table tried to rectify the situation and did not have communication, Judge said the placing still stands.
 - Need to re-evaluate the good standing rule. An out of county member showed in the pig show but did not allow time to have it approved prior.
- Brittany Carr – asked if there was still a Hardship Award. Her daughter lost a goat in June and was wondering if there was a way to help recoup funds. Will look into.

July 31st – Autumn Yslas shared concern for the fairs attendance and that people are afraid to come forward and offer advice. Johnny was dissatisfied with the July fairboard meeting and public only being allowed 3 minutes to speak. The government standard is 5 minutes which is what was stated at the meeting. They also shared that there wasn't enough in advertising for the fair. Delores let her know there are many committees that people may join to help with the fair without having to join the fair board.
