1. **Zone Change #1 Berry 23-002**

The purpose of this rezone is to change the zone district from Low Density Residential to Agricultural Suburban. The applicant believes this property was improperly zoned as livestock was being raised on the property when the zoning was established. Livestock is not allowed in the Low Density Residential zone district.

Additionally, the applicant has a separate application submitted with the Planning and Zoning office for a Boundary Line Adjustment. The applicant's lot, located at 1422 Walnut Street is currently 1.02 acres in the Low Density Residential zone district. The additional acreage which the applicant wishes to add is located in the Agricultural Suburban zone district.

2. Fremont County Road Naming and Site Address Regulations

Request: Add section XXIV to the Fremont County Subdivision regulations. Planning and Zoning has recognized the need for a road naming and addressing section within the Subdivision Regulations. We have identified numerous driveways servicing a large number of homes or driveways with multiple intersections which would otherwise be considered new roadways. This creates a significant obstacle to first responders and public safety.
