 - a. County Manager Report, Sunny Bryant, County Manager

Manager Bryant reported on the Colorado Opportunity Scholarship Initiative grant meeting, the Regional Managers Meeting, the Goal Setting Session, the Weed Board Meeting, and the Penrose Chamber of Commerce Meeting.

b. Sales & Use Tax Report, Sunny Bryant, County Manager

Manager Bryant reported the November collections for Retail Sales Tax were \$339,082, Sheriff-Retail Sales Tax were \$226,055 and Lodging Tax were \$464. In December, the Auto Use Tax collected was \$80,919, and the Sheriff-Auto Use Tax was \$53,946. The preliminary Construction Use Tax for December was \$11,161, and the preliminary Sheriff-Construction Use Tax was \$7,441.

Commissioner Bell talked about the Goal Setting Session and the excitement over the goals that have been accomplished while she has been in office. She will be attending Legislative Days sponsored by Action 22 partnered with Club 20 and Progressive 15 in Denver to remind legislature of the rural part of the state.

1. Recognition of the 2016 Vital Statistics Fire Star Performance Award Representative: Rick Miklich, Public & Environmental Health Director

Rick Miklich congratulated the Vital Statistics Office for acing their semi-annual audit. Every one of the 59 offices across the state are audited for five criteria. The Canon City Office has received a five star award for passing the audit each time for the past four years. Matthew Kay, Paula Spurlin, and Christina Taylor are the current registrars.

2. Arkansas River Roundtable Reports Representative: Gary Barber, Project Coordinator

Gary Barber explained the Roundtable was formed in response to the drought to address the needs of the Arkansas River Basin. In 2015, an outreach plan was created that is now in the implementation stage. He gave a report on the current and future projects including mitigation and cleanup for the Hayden Pass Fire burn area.

Rick Romano said the Natural Resources Conservation Service has been involved with the implementation of the mitigation project through identifying where the needs are.

Steve Morrissey with Emergency Management has been in contact with USDS to provide the warning devices for the implementation of fire clean up. He has been coordinating with different agencies including the Arkansas River Roundtable.

Commissioner Payne as board member of the Upper Arkansas Water Conservation District has been a part of the implementation of the various Roundtable projects in Fremont County.
