Sanitizer label says 1/2 teaspoon per 32 ounces, take this down to 1/4 teaspoon and use test strips to ensure proper concentration.



FCDPHE received a complaint about ill staff working in the facility. Discussed with Director and gave handouts on staff and children illness policies. For health and safety of all children and staff, ill employees should be excluded, see CDPHE sample staff illness policy for guidance on conditions that require exclusion and when they should return to work. Directors and supervisors are responsible for observing staff for signs of illness.

6 immunization records reviewed, all complainant.

Food service: Breakfast 8:20 am to 9. Lunch 11:30 to noon. Snack 2:30 to 3:15.

Toys that are placed in children's mouths or otherwise contaminated by body fluids shall be washed, rinsed, and sanitized prior to use by another child. Ensure these items are being washed and rinsed as well, and not only sanitized.
